The aim in GCSE Drama is to provide students with the skills and knowledge to think creatively, collaborate with others and inspire lifelong appreciation of drama and theatre.

At the Albion Academy, pupils study the Edexcel GCSE Drama qualification. Pupils will work both practical and theoretically through devising and script work as well as their written exam work.
