



# Year 11 Independent Study Booklet

# Expectations

This booklet outlines your Independent Study tasks for this half term for all of your subjects.

In Key Stage 3 you will be set one piece of Independent Study per day for each subject. For each subject, Independent Study will be set and due in on the same day the following week to make it easier for you to manage your time.

If you are struggling with your Independent Study, it is your responsibility to see your class teacher before the deadline to receive support.

You must have your Independent Study book for every lesson, it is part of your equipment.

### Independent study Overview

At The Albion Academy, we believe that Independent Study encourages the development of skills and allows students to take more ownership of their education. Promotion and emphasis of Independent Study skills from the start of Year 7 helps to prepare students for Key Stage 4 and beyond, and, in turn, aids our students' progression and development.

### What Independent Study does my child receive?

There are two types of independent study: Paper and online. Students in Y7-9 will receive online work from subjects. Students in Y10 and 11 will receive a mixture of paper based and online Independent Study. How much Independent Study should my child receive?

Students in Year 7 should spend approximately 30-40 minutes per subject

#### What additional help is available for Independent Study?

There is a daily independent study club that takes place before and after school. Students can use this time to complete Independent Study in a quiet environment or ask for help from subject specialists. If you have any questions about Independent Study, please contact:

# How can you support your child with Independent Study?

- Make sure your child brings their journal, folder, Independent Study booklet and exercise book to school every day.
- Check your child's Independent Study book every day and encourage them to complete their work in order of priority, completing the Independent Study tasks with the soonest due date first.
- Make sure your child has a quiet, well-lit place to do work.
- Avoid having your child do Independent Study with the television on or in places with other distractions.
- Be positive about Independent Study. Tell your child how important school is. The attitude you express about Independent Study will be the attitude your child acquires.
- Help your child with time management. Establish a set time each day for doing Independent Study. Don't let your child leave Independent Study until just before bedtime. Think about using a weekend morning or afternoon for working on big projects.
- Stay informed. E-mail your child's teacher. Communicate with your child's AP link.
- Encourage your child to attend Independent Study rooms. Independent Study rooms run every day before and after school. students can work with teachers and access resources to help them complete their Independent Study successfully.
