Component 2 – Performance from Text Pupils develop performances using extracts from published plays. Pupils develop characterisation skills to communicate narrative and intention. 	Assessment: November Mock 2023
Spring 1	 Component 2 – Performance from Text Pupils develop performances using extracts from published plays. Pupils develop characterisation skills to communicate narrative and intention. Pupils write intention statement in preparation for examiner. Pupils take time to learn lines. Component 3 – Theatre Makers in Practice Watch live theatre and prepare examination notes. 	Assessment: Final Performance Exam - February 20% of overall qualification.
Spring 2	 Component 3 – Theatre Makers in Practice Recap and further develop writing structures. Recap and further develop knowledge of context and character. Develop writing structures for live theatre evaluation. 	Assessment: 40% of qualification. March Mock
Summer 1	 Component 3 – Theatre Makers in Practice Pupils prepare for their final written exam through revision tasks and practice papers. Pupils apply knowledge of production elements and performance skills to writing. Pupils apply knowledge of An Inspector Calls to writing. Pupils evaluate the use of production elements and performance skills in live theatre. Pupils will perform this devised piece to an audience. 	Assessment: Final written Exam – May 40% of qualification
