



Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

Thank you so much for your support over the year. We cannot achieve what we do in the school without your help, so we appreciate this greatly.

This is quite a long communication, but each part is important as it lists how we will be ending this year, how we will be starting the next year and some important information to help you over the summer holidays.

Firstly, I'm really pleased to inform you that we will again be spending a significant amount of money over the summer holiday upgrading the site for your child ready for September, including:

- Brand new changing rooms in PE
- Brand new serveries in the dining room and a new dining layout to further reduce the queuing time for students
- A new ramp to our bottom yard to allow access to this area for all students in the school
- Brand new fencing around our MUGA all weather pitch near the top yard

I know that this will make the school an even better place for the students, so we look forward to seeing this in September.

End of Term Arrangements & New Term Arrangements

Our school year ends on Friday 18th July at 12:30pm. We will release students from school at this time but will ensure that all students leave with a hot grab and go meal as they leave.

The 2025-26 year starts again as follows:

- Wednesday 3rd September:
 - Year 7 start school at 8:25am and finish school at 3:00pm
 - Year 11 pupils attend school with a parent at their appointment times for their Year 11 kickstart meet
 - Year 8, 9 and 10 pupils do not attend school this day
- Thursday 4th September:
 - All pupils start school at 8:25am and finish school at 3:00pm

We expect that all students attend school on time every single school day. Our attendance goal is 100% for all students with 97% attendance as a minimum expectation over the year. This means only 5 days absent from school over the entirety of 2023-24. We cannot authorise holidays during term time sadly.

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Uniform in 2025-2026

The wearing of full Academy uniform is expected and is an important part of The Albion Academy value of respect which promotes positive attitudes, high standards and a sense of personal pride. We ask for parental support and would like to take this opportunity to communicate our uniform standards clearly. They are as follows:

- School blazers are compulsory whilst inside the school building. Jumpers are optional.
- White buttoned long/short sleeved shirt with a formal academy tie.
- Smart black trousers (leggings or flared trousers are not acceptable) or black pleated skirt that falls below the knee
- Socks must be plain black with no bows or frills (ankle or knee length are acceptable)
- All footwear must be entirely black, polishable and have no coloured logos or soles and not be of ankle height. Boots, heeled footwear or trainers of any sort are not considered acceptable footwear.



All students will be expected to carry a backpack to ensure that they have all their equipment and PE kit. We will not allow handbags/man bags as acceptable school bags. As a rule of thumb, the backpack must be large enough to fit an outdoor coat.



Hair, make-up and jewellery:

- Neat in appearance
- Navy or black hair bobbles/clips
- Make-up should not be worn
- A wristwatch – no smartwatches

The following are banned and are not acceptable uniform:

- Hoodies or non-academy jumpers
- Patterned tights
- Extreme hairstyles
- Shaven or partially shaven eyebrows

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- Visible make-up, including false eyelashes, nail varnish or acrylic nails
- Facial piercing or body piercing (for example nose, lip, tongue or belly button)
- Ear piercings
- Any jewellery

Students whose religion requires them to wear a head scarf or cap are permitted to do so and we ask this is plain black in colour. Outdoor coats may be worn outside the building but must be removed when directed during line-ups and placed in bags or carried over the arm.

Students who are not wearing full academy uniform will be required to 'Stop and Fix'. Where uniform standards require a significant correction, this will be logged as a 'First Impression' on Class Charts, and students will be issued with a next day 30-minute after school detention.

Refusal to comply with the Academy's uniform policy, or where the academy is unable to resolve uniform corrections despite best endeavours, will result in students being placed in the Reflection Room for five periods, including a same-day detention of up to 45-minutes, or until the uniform issue is resolved with your support.

First Impressions – Academic Journal & Equipment in 2025-26

Students are expected to always carry an Academic Journal with them. This will be provided upon their return to school to support their independent study, travel around the school and understanding of their daily timetables. Students without their Academic Journal will immediately be issued with a next day 30-minute detention.

There are also important changes to the stationery and equipment expectations that will come into effect from September 2025. These changes are part of a whole-school initiative to support our pupils in becoming more independent, responsible, and prepared learners— ambitious skills that are essential not only in school but also in life beyond the classroom.

Essential Daily Equipment in 2025-26

From September, all pupils will be expected to bring the following items to school every day:

- **1 black pen** (plus a spare)
- **1 green pen**
- **1 pencil**
- **1 ruler**
- **1 bookmark**
- **School Journal**
- **Independent Study Book**

These core items will help students stay organised, take responsibility for their learning, and be fully prepared for the school day.



To support all families, the school will provide each pupil with the following at the start of the September term:

- **2 black pens**
- **2 green pens**
- **2 pencils**
- **1 bookmark**
- **1 pencil case**
- **1 School Journal**
- **1 Independent Study Book**

We are also pleased to be opening a school shop, which will operate each morning before school and during lunchtimes. Pupils will be able to purchase replacement items or additional equipment as needed at affordable prices. Parent and carers will also be able to purchase equipment through the Parent Pay account.

Equipment Expectations and Consequences in 2025-26

Pupils must bring their own equipment to school; however, it will be their responsibility to look after and replace any lost or broken items. To help encourage consistency and accountability the following will occur daily:

- Equipment checks will take place each morning during form time. Pupils will receive positive Classcharts points for being equipped. These points go towards student of the week awards and our Character badges for Student Etiquettes.
- Any missing equipment will be logged as a 'First Impressions' consequence on Classcharts.
- 'First Impressions' consequences will result in an after-school detention the following day for not having the correct equipment for learning.

Pendleton Library: Pendleton Gateway, 1 Broadwalk, Salford M6 5FX

Part of Salford City Councils Libraries, Pendleton Library is open to anybody and has a wide range of book on offer for both adults and children as well as access to internet and computers and children's activities during the holidays.

Open: Mon – Thurs: 8am – 10pm, Fri: 8am – 6:30pm and Sat: 9am – 1pm.

Clifford Whitworth Library: The, Broadwalk, Salford M5 4WT

A university library open to the public every day.

Open: Mon – Fri until 7pm and Sat – Sun until 5pm (after these times you need a student ID to enter and use the library).

The Working Class Movement Library: 51 Crescent, Salford M5 4WX

This library contains books, periodicals, pamphlets, archives, and artifacts that relate to the different areas of development in the working class created by the Industrial Revolution in Salford.

Open: Tues – Fri: 10am – 4pm.

Salford Local History Library: Salford Museum & Art Gallery, Crescent, Salford M5 4WU

Located in the Salford Museum & Art Gallery, this library has lot of elements of our community's history in the texts they house there such as maps and newspapers as well as over 70,000 photos.

Open: Weds – Fri: 9:30am – 4pm (appointment/pre-book only)

Broughton Library: 50 Rigby St, Lower Broughton, Salford M7 4BQ

Broughton Library is also part of Salford City Councils Libraries and they have books for everyone – they also have a Jewish Collection and Ukrainian Language books.

Open: Mon – Thurs: 8am – 10pm | Fri: 8am – 6:30pm

Manchester Central Library: St Peter's Square, Manchester M2 5PD

Known as the “headquarters of the city's library and information service in Manchester.”, Central Library has so many ways to access information – they have books as expected but there's archives, parliamentary papers, and the Henry Watson music library.

Free School Meals

Free School Meals are more than just a meal. For every child with free school meal entitlement the Academy will receive more funding to invest in more staffing, enrichment opportunities and learning support for children. You will also receive access to school holiday food vouchers and access to funded holiday club places for your children during school holidays.

Finally, to help your child feel confident and prepared for the return to school, here are a few suggestions for that final week of the holidays in August:

- Encourage your child to pack their bag the night before school.
- Replace lost or broken items as soon as possible.
- Check and label all equipment with your child's name.
- Discuss with your child the importance of being organised and responsible.
- Use a checklist at home for the first few weeks in September to help form good habits.
