Dear Parent/Carer,

Year 9 Mid-Year Assessments, Monday 12th January – Friday 23rd January

In January, all students in year 9 will take Mid-Year assessments. These tests are useful for many reasons:

- Review progress so far this year
- Provide practice with formal exams, preparing students for GCSEs and BTECs
- Help teachers plan the curriculum for the rest of the year
- Support both students and teachers to make informed decisions about options choices later this year

When and where

- **English, Maths, Science:** written tests in the sports hall (Friday 16th January)
- **Geography, History, MFL:** written tests in classrooms (teachers will tell student exact dates)
- **Other subjects:** no written test. Student will receive an average score from class assessments done in Term 1

If your child is entitled to an exam access arrangement, we will make sure this is in place for them for the exams that take place in the sports hall. For the classroom assessments, reasonable adjustments will be made for students where appropriate.

Once assessments have been completed and marked, results will be shared with both students and families through a Mid-Year Report. We will also produce a Rank Order, to see how students have performed against other students in all subjects and to inform set changes.

Year 9 students will also soon start their Guided Choices process where they will select subjects to study at GCSE level. Mid-Year assessments should be taken seriously as students prepare to choose their options for year 10 and 11.

Students have received a revision pack to support them in preparation for these assessments. You will be able to find the resources on our website here:
